Course Objective**Material Covered:**

Students will deepen their knowledge of inpatient Family Medicine by directly taking care of inpatients on a busy teaching service. Working with residents and faculty, students will learn about the diagnosis and management of common problems such as chest pain; myocardial infarction; cardiac, hepatic and/or renal failure; diabetes; metastatic cancer; pneumonia, sepsis, and other infectious diseases; COPD; HIV; and GI bleeding. Nursing home and low risk obstetric patients, deliveries, and newborn care are managed on this service. Students will also learn how to consult and to be a consultant for other inpatient services. In addition, the student will learn about serious life-threatening diseases, management of Emergency Department and ICU patients, and end of life care.
